### **Stone Research Interest Group**


Research on stones (urolithiasis, nephrolithiasis) involves a significant number of CAIRIBU investigators, trainees, collaborators, and colleagues. The P20 FORWARD Centers at Mayo Clinic (Co-PIs, Kevin Koo, MD, MPH and John Lieske, MD) and Duke University (PI, Pei Zhong, PhD) are currently in active grant cycles. Prior CAIRIBU P20 Exploratory Urology Centers - those at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (PI, Dean Assimos, MD) and the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (Gregory Tasian, MD, MSc, MSCE) - continue their research.
